Interlocutor's instructions

PART 1 (3 minutes)

- I: LanguageCert International ESOL, Speaking, Communicator level, (give today's date).

 (Give candidate's full name.) Exam begins. Hello. My name's (give full name). Can you spell your surname for me, please?
- C: (Spells surname.)
- I: Thank you. Where are you from?
- C: (Responds.)
- I: Thank you. Now, Part One. I'm going to ask you some questions about yourself and your ideas. (Choose **up to five** questions, one from each of the different topic areas, as time allows. Name the topic; e.g., 'Now, **Television**.')

Topics

Television

- How much TV do you watch in a week?
- What kinds of shows do you like and dislike?
- What are the advantages and disadvantages of watching TV?
- What responsibilities do parents have regarding their children's TV habits?

Friendship

- What qualities do you look for in a good friend?
- How can friends help you in times of difficulty?
- Can you tell me about ways friends have helped you?
- Would you prefer a wide circle of friends or just a few close friends? (Why?)

Leisure facilities

- What leisure facilities do you and your friends use?
- What kinds of leisure facilities are there in your town?
- What leisure facilities are popular with older people?
- If you were responsible, what leisure facilities would you build in your area?

Public transport

- If you had a lot of money, how would you travel?
- What would improve public transport for you in your area?
- What's the best thing about public transport where you live?
- Why do you think some people spend a lot of money to fly first class?

Foreign language ability

- Which languages would you like to learn and why?
- Why do you think it is important to speak a foreign language?
- How useful have you found speaking English when you travel?
- Why do you think some people learn a language and then forget how to speak it?
- C: (Responds.)
- 1: (Interlocutor responds and/or comments **briefly**.)
- I: Thank you.

PART 2 (3 minutes)

I: Now, Part Two. We are going to role-play some situations. I want you to start or respond. First situation *(choose one situation from A)*.

Α

- I'm your new neighbour. I start.

 Hello. My name's ______. I've just moved in next door.
- We're flatmates. You don't really want to go out tonight. I start. Come on, we'll be late if we don't go soon.
- We're in a queue in a cafeteria. I start.

 This place seems really busy today. Is it usually this crowded?
- We're colleagues. I start.
 You know the boss is retiring at the end of the month... What shall we do?
- C: (Responds.)
- 1: (Role-play the situation with the candidate approximately two turns each.)
- I: Second situation (choose one situation from **B**).

- You're just leaving my party and realise you don't have enough money to get a taxi home. You start.
- You bought tickets for the cinema tonight. Tell me where and when to meet. You start.
- I am your teacher/boss. You have just arrived very late at school/work. You start.
- We're colleagues. You want me to cover for you this weekend. You start.
- C: (Initiates.)
- I: (Role-play the situation with the candidate approximately two turns each.)
- 1: (Role-play a third situation from **A** or **B** if time allows.)
- I: Thank you.

PART 3 (3 minutes)

PART 4 (4 minutes including follow-up questions)

I: In Part Four, you are going to talk on your own for two minutes. Your topic is *(choose topic for candidate)*.

Topics

- A Care for elderly people
- **B** Important inventions
- C Some festivals in your country
- I: (Hand over piece of paper and pen/pencil.) You now have thirty seconds to write some notes to help you. So your topic is (repeat topic). (Withdraw eye contact for thirty seconds. Leave recorder running.)
- I: (Candidate's name), please start.
- C: (Talks.)
- I: (When candidate has talked for a maximum of two minutes, say, 'Thank you', and then ask some follow-up questions.)

Follow-up questions

Care for elderly people

- What's your opinion on care homes for the elderly?
- How do people spend their retirement in your country?
- What problems might come from having a larger elderly population?
- Do you think people should work longer before retiring? (Why?/ Why not?)

Important inventions

- Which modern invention do you use most?
- What invention would make the world a better place?
- Which modern invention has changed life significantly?
- Do you think any modern invention has had a bad effect on society?

Some festivals in your country

- How have these festivals changed in your country in the past 50 years?
- How important is it for children to learn about traditions?
- Which festival would a visitor enjoy the most?
- Which festivals always have traditional food?
- I: Thank you, (give candidate's name.) That is the end of the exam.
